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Showtime AllStars Program Rules

- If you ever have a problem, with anything, please do not hesitate to contact the gym owner or your child's coach. We are here for YOU.
- If you have any questions or concerns that need immediate attention please use the following chain of command: 1. Gym Owner 2. Team Coach 2. Team Mom
- It is your responsibility to wear the appropriate practice wear to every practice (found on the website under members area).
- Practice is not optional! Be on time and ready when practice starts. You have 3 unexcused practices & 2 weeks vacation. After that you will be removed from the team.
- If you are injured you are still to attend all practices and competitions (in uniform), until you are released from your doctor.
- Any additional clothing items, cell phones, gym bags must be placed in the locker room. No clothing is to be placed by the floor you are practicing on. Cell phones need to be silenced.
- NO gossip about any other teams (allstar or school), NO gossip about a child on your team or in the program. It is much better to address a problem than to listen to idle gossip.
- No profanity or abusive language.
- Please keep in mind the gym is not a babysitting service, nor is it a playground. If you are not at team practice or tumbling practice you should not be running around the gym or using the equipment. Please wait in the waiting room.
- You need to be on time for all practices, competitions and scheduled events. Punctuality is a MUST.
- All squad and routine decisions are left to the coaches. If you need to discuss a problem please do so with your coaches after practice.
- Never post any negative comments on any websites or chat rooms (facebook, myspace etc.).
- Practices may change or be added at any time during the season.
- Please do not bring valuables to the gym; we will not be responsible for them.
- Only cheerleaders and coaches are allowed in practice. Please wait in the waiting room for practice to finish.
- There will be no arguing or gossiping of coaches decisions. If you have a questions ASK the owner.
- If a problem arises between you and a teammate or parents, the problem will be addressed with all parties involved and the owner.
- Good sportsmanship, polite manners and a kind disposition are mandatory when involved in any Showtime practice, competition or event!!
- It is your responsibility to know what is going on. Parent meetings are on the calendar and minutes of those meetings if you miss, are readable on the calendar after the meeting.

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Code of Conduct

1.) GENERAL PRINCIPLES APPLICABLE TO ALL PARTICIPANTS

1.1) **Trustworthiness.** All participants shall:

- (a) Be honest, and never deceive, cheat or steal
- (b) Have the courage to do the right thing
- (c) Work to build a good reputation
- (d) Demonstrate loyalty to family, friends, teammates

1.2) **Respect.** All participants shall:

- (a) Treat others with respect, and be considerate of the feelings of others
- (b) Demonstrate a tolerance toward differences
- (c) Use good manners, and avoid offensive language and taunting
- (d) Never slander, degrade, threaten, hurt or hit anyone

1.3) **Responsibility.** All participants shall:

- (a) Use self-control and self-discipline
- (b) Be accountable for all choices and actions
- (c) Demonstrate reliability
- (d) Exhibit supportive behavior and a positive attitude

1.4) **Fairness.** All participants shall:

- (a) Adhere to all laws, rules, policies, and guidelines
- (b) Be open-minded and demonstrate the ability to listen to others
- (c) Not pass blame carelessly
- (d) Share equitably and take turns for a particular situation as appropriate
- (e) Never take advantage of others

1.5) **Caring.** All participants shall:

- (a) Demonstrate compassion, kindness, and forgiveness
- (b) Provide assistance to others in need when appropriate

1.6) **Citizenship.** All participants shall:

- (a) Respect authority and demonstrate cooperation.

2.) ATHLETES CODE OF CONDUCT

2.1) **General.** All athletes shall recognize that being a member of Showtime AllStars carries with it responsibilities and rewards, and they shall not only embrace those responsibilities, but also conduct themselves both in and out of the facility in a way that exhibits respect for others and them self.

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2.2) **Specific Principles.** All athletes shall therefore resolve themselves to conduct them self with dignity as an athlete and as a citizen of the community, recognizing and accepting that they shall:

- (a) Accept accountability for all behavior and it's outcomes
- (b) Honor obligations and promises
- (c) Exercise self-control
- (d) Be willing to be fair with others in dealing in and out of the facility
- (e) Take pride in themselves and their accomplishments, but never at the expense of demeaning another person or group
- (f) Respect the efforts of others
- (g) Respect authority
- (h) Play by the spirit, not just the letter, of the rules of the game

3.) PARENTS CODE OF CONDUCT

3.1) **General.** All parents and guardians shall pledge to provide positive support, care and encouragement for their child participating in activities at Showtime AllStars by following this Code of Conduct.

3.2) **Specific Principles.** All parents and guardians shall therefore resolve to conduct themselves with dignity as a citizen of the community, recognizing and accepting that they shall:

- (a) Encourage good sportsmanship by demonstrating positive support for all players, coaches, and judges at every competition, practice or event.
- (b) Place the emotional and physical well-being of their child and the other athletes ahead of a personal desire to win
- (c) Support efforts to maintain a safe and healthy environment
- (d) Support coaches working with your child, in order to encourage a positive and enjoyable experience for all
- (e) Demand a sports environment that is free of drugs and alcohol and refrain from use at all competitions and events
- (f) Do their very best to make it a fun and memorable experience, and always remember it is for the youth.
- (g) Encourage your child to treat teammates, coaches, spectators, judges and competitors with respect.
- (h) Promise to help your child enjoy the sport experience in whatever way possible, such as being a respectable fan

4.) ENFORCEMENT OF THE CODE OF CONDUCT

4.1) **Responsibility.** Responsibility for enforcement of this Code of Conduct shall reside with the Owner/Program Director of Showtime AllStars.

4.2) **Enforcement Action.** The Owner/Program Director of Showtime AllStars shall take whatever measures necessary to enforce this Code of Conduct, up to and including any of the following actions:

- (a) Written warning for first offense due to failure to comply with the Code of Conduct
- (b) Removal of an athlete from the program due to his or her failure to comply with the Code of Conduct
- (c) Removal of an athlete from the program due to his or her parents' failure to comply with the Code of Conduct
